What: The Native American Student Union (NASU) at Colorado College invites you to their 35th annual [NASU Powwow](#). This gathering is a long-held tradition at CC since 1991 that reflects similar traditional gatherings throughout the region going back many generations.

Why: The NASU Powwow serves to spread joy and community while celebrating the resilience and pride of our indigenous communities. The NASU Powwow welcomed 600 people for a day of community, vending, dancing, and celebration at the Fine Arts Center last year, and hopes the larger venue will provide space for even more spectators.
