- ⇒ recognizes cultural and linguistic variance as an asset in learning and teaching

### GS213 Global Scholars Program: Advanced Approaches to Academic Success for CLD Students (Adjunct Course) Blocks 1 & 2

This course promotes academic success during CLD students' transition to Colorado College. Meetings may cover a range of topics including but not limited to FYP coursework, research and ethical scholarship skills, writing in academic genres, reading and oral presentation strategies, language support, and culturally-contextualized rhetorical practices.

# ED200 Teaching Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Learners (Block Course) Block 6

This course introduces students to theories, applications, and issues related to teaching English as a Second Language (ESL). Students read second language acquisition theory and learn strategies for working with diverse populations and making content area lessons accessible to CLD students.
