- IV. Black History Month Discussion:
 - Sakina: I want to follow up on Ella's comment from the last full council
 - Fargol: We talked about a collab with BSU and Inclusion
 - Sophie: CAL is collaborating with SpeakEasy to honor black poets, I think we can start attending community events as a greater effort to support black history month.
 - Sally: I think we can recognize that nothing is being done in the moment for black students (money and food)
 - Mika: Been working with Black Women to find a collab with CCSGA social media
 - Gaby: BSU meeting tonight
 - Nicolette: Fer and I had a meeting about different initiatives-- one such as the club funding going to donations and establishing a fund for black students. We have a list of smaller things we wanna do: Statement of solidarity, working on a campaign on instagram to highlight black community efforts, working on a butler center book club thing, reach out about funding. Wanna find a more immediate form of reparations and potentially reach out to mutual aid, and maybe making posters to distribute to RA's to post on halls about Black History Month
 - Dore: John and I are employed at the butler center and I just wanted to say that if someone from inclusion wants to email us to set up a meeting, please let us know.
 - Sakina: We could have earmarked funds for particular heritage months or events (i.e. BSU wouldn't have to request but would be able to have it immediately).
- V. Inclusion Committee Resolution:
 - Anusha: Ella and I talked about having a resolution in CCSGA that promises support to Black students and work with CC to become an antiracist institution.
 - Sakina: A resolution is a statement of support from CCSGA. Inclusion would bring it up and we would vote if we support it and then we would have to commit to it. We also talked about supporting other marginalized communities.
 - Sunderland: I am in support of this-- I would love to contribute
 - Sophie: They are also sent to the co-presidents. So it is a good move and shows some political power. I think it would be good to show support in concrete ways and black faculty as well.
- VI. Clubs donating funds:

- Sakina: Been talking about clubs being able to push club funds over to donate-like mutual ade
- Lilly: Clubs have been pushing for additional operating budgets to go to something good. Talking to Lori Seager from the finance office, she suggested we have a formalized process. Since we can't do this right now to our bylaws, I want to get unofficial approval so in the future this will be seamless.
