- Establish a gateway to campus that respects the adjacent historic neighborhood
- Connect and consider indoor activities and the outdoor environment
- Be a model of need based use and sustainability for the nation
- Create a Tiger-branded home ice venue advantage

Parking and Traffic:

- Provide parking as close to the arena as possible
- Provide additional parking on campus (surface and/or garage)
 - On-site, Fine Arts Center, expand existing campus lots, additional onstreet parking within campus
- Minimize on-street parking
- Minimize parking impacts to existing residents and businesses
 - Consider residential parking permit program
 - Encourage parking in downtown garages, implement shuttle
- Use nearby available surface lots
- Minimize traffic in the neighborhoods; maintain the beauty of the neighborhood
- Minimize traffic congestion at intersections
- Implement valet parking
- Encourage multi-modal transportation (bike, pedestrian, etc.)

User Experience:

- Consider an enhanced customer experience reflective of Division 1 hockey games
- Direct the season ticket holders to the priority parking areas
- Are current season ticketholders guaranteed access to season tickets in new arena
- Chair-back seats, cup holders concessions choices, wifi access
- Provide easy-access parking to minimize game attendees driving around looking for a parking space
- Minimize safety concerns for individuals walking in the neighborhood
- Ingress and egress before and after games traffic control and safety
- Have reserved parking lots for season ticket holders

Aesthetics, Architecture and Neighborhood Context:

- Consider alternative location for arena
- Make sure any parking garages look nice and fit in with the campus and the neighborhood
- Assure historic preservation of the neighborhood
- Concerns about building height
- Entrance to locations to arena need to be well designed
- NHL size rink
- Capacity of arena (too big or too small)
- Concerns about neighborhood businesses and organizations (yoga studio, All Souls Unitarian Church)



C4C Tiers of Programmed Events

- **Tier 1** Events such as collegiate playoffs or Olympic qualifying finals.
- **Tier 2** Events such as NGB's or Para Olympic
- **Tier 3** Events such as small NGB's or other amateur sports

C4C Robson Arena Events...

- Many events occur over multiple days and neither participants nor spectators are expected to attend all day and/or every day of the event.
- Participants, coaches, trainers, and close family comprise 30% of total attendance and will utilize group transportation
- Peak time attendance will be significantly less than total attendance
- Events only during summer and block breaks, holidays and most frequently on weekends




As JLG looked at the building as a whole and how it aligns with the overall CC goals, we saw that the building must be designed inside and out to engage students and the community to **create a sense of place**. A public **plaza** on the northwest corner **extends the campus quad** to the front door of the arenas grand lobby. The plaza serves as a gathering space for events and pre and post game celebrations. The glazed **lobby is a beacon** that can be seen from the heart of the campus, especially after dark when it will glow like a lantern welcoming students, faculty and the public. **Xeriscape landscaping** protects the environment while creating an inviting atmosphere. The **faceted building form** is derived from the **contours** of the nearby **mountain landscape** and the **natural geology** surrounding the entire community. The facade is clad in a variety of **textures and layers** in response to the layered textures seen in the surrounding geology. **Colorado Stone** ties to CC's existing campus architecture and respects the desire to retain some of the character of Palmer Hall's historic use of stone. **Glazing** is used sparingly to align with the **net zero** requirements yet strategically located to **foster views, daylight harvesting and connect inside to outside**. The building uses lower scale elements where possible to relate to the surrounding neighborhood context. Deep overhangs and exterior / internal shading devices protect the interior of the building and the ice from sunlight while allowing natural light to filter in. A sloped roof is perfectly suited to capture solar energy. And finally, the southeast corner of the site acts as a **gateway to the campus**.















Academic configuration during school hours to support student-athlete studies and guidance.










Sports Club configuration on gameday.










Outdoor connection with views to Pikes Peak for campus programs such group yoga sessions.








NET ZERO ENERGY-SUSTAINABLE DESIGN APPROACH

- Geothermal ground-source heat pumps, waste heat energy recovery systems, CO2 demand-control ventilation
- Ice refrigeration system with heat recovery chiller connected to building heating systems and geothermal heat pumps
- High-efficiency, continuously dimmable LED lights, occupancy / vacancy sensors, optimal daylight harvesting
- Air-tight building envelope w/ R-40 roof, R-36 walls, optimized quantity and orientation of glazing
- Extremely low flow plumbing fixtures
 - Recycling and waste management
 - Site planning and landscape design
- - 35MW Grazing Yak solar array is on track per Colorado Springs Utilities (CSU).
 - CC anticipates needing 9MW (920 kW for Robson Arena).
 - Array is located on 270 acre site in El Paso County.
 - Construction is scheduled to begin 7/1/2019, with commercial operation before 12/31/2019.
 - CC has signed a letter of intent with CSU, and has first rights when the power is set to be delivered.
