Ryan earned his Ph.D. from Harvard University and is an internationally recognized scholar of American music. His research and teaching explore how music changes meaning across time, place, and performance, blending historical insight with a deep appreciation for lived musical experiences. He is a life-long Beatles fan and regularly offers a block at CC titled “The Beatles Then and Now.” A passionate traveler and educator, Ryan has guided alumni, students, and colleagues in discovering how music both reflects and refracts the societies from which it emerges. At CC he has led innovative, interdisciplinary projects that connect the arts with cultural history, politics, and place. Ryan is the author of *Arranging Gershwin: Rhapsody in Blue and the Creation of an American Icon* and co-editor of “*We Didn’t Start the Fire*”: *Billy Joel and Popular Music Studies*.

Grab your guitar pick and drumsticks and *Come Together* to the birthplace of the British Invasion. Join Dr. Ryan Bañagale, Beatles fan, Professor of Music, and Director of the Crown Center for Teaching at Colorado College, as we walk in the footsteps of John, Paul, George, and Ringo from Liverpool to London.

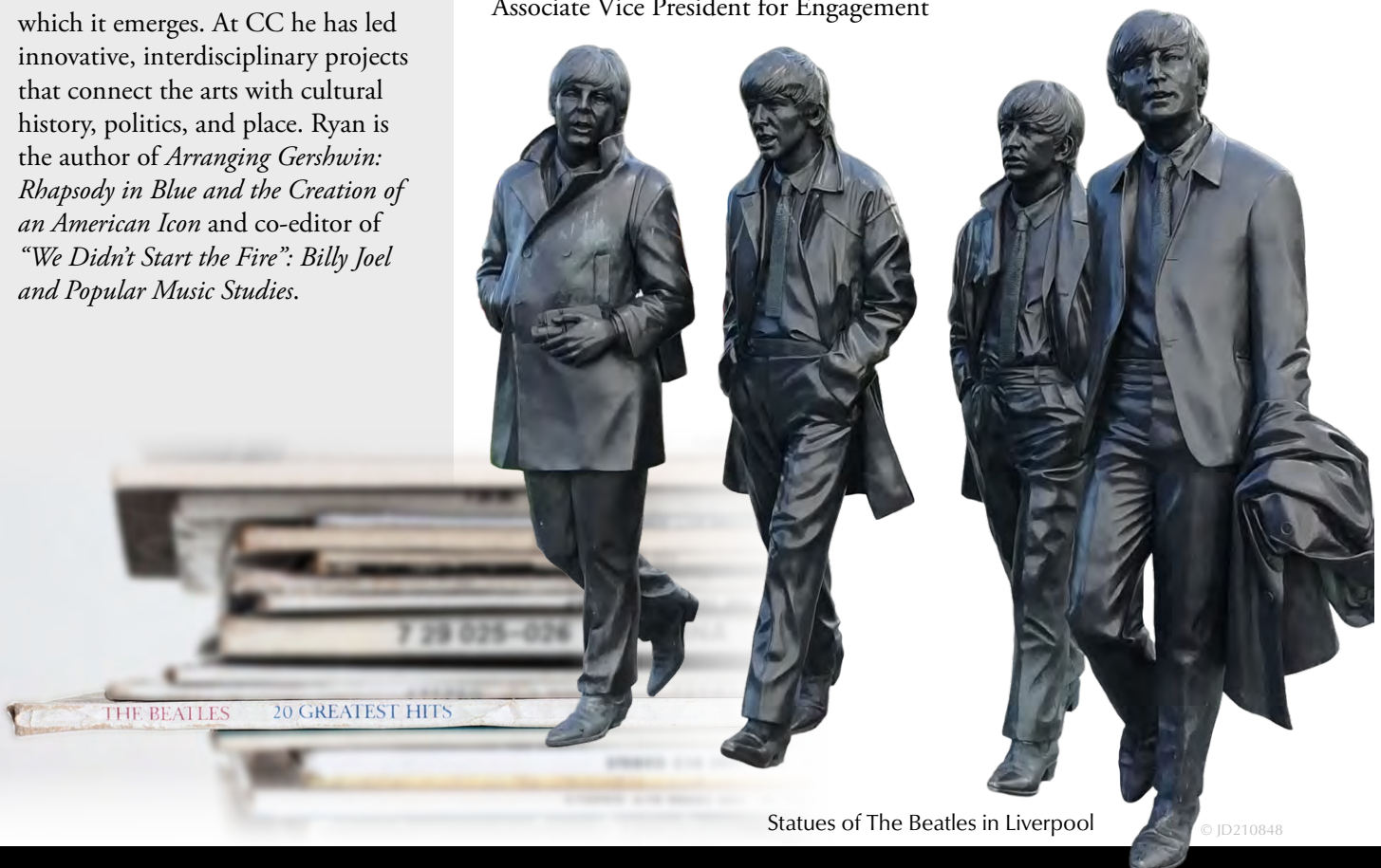
We will see Liverpool’s iconic locations made famous by the Fab Four, including Penny Lane and Strawberry Fields. We will immerse ourselves in their lives and their incredible rise to fame. Of course, we cannot go to Liverpool without a visit to the “Cradle of British Pop Music,” the Cavern Club, where we should be ready to cheer and scream (not so loud that the music is drowned out, and let’s try to leave the fainting in the 60s) as we sing every word to every song sung by a live cover band of The Beatles.

Next, we drive to Wales for the day to re-energize ourselves before we head to London to continue our walk in the footsteps of *the Four Lads From Liverpool*. While in London, we will stop at Abbey Road Studios to take a photo and leave our mark on the graffiti wall, enjoy a rock ‘n’ roll music walking tour of Soho, and discover where The Beatles, Stones, Hendrix, and Bowie played and hung out (and learn some juicy scuttlebutt). Before we say farewell, we visit the Cotswolds for the day to enjoy bucolic English towns and see where The Beatles kicked off their first headlining UK tour.

Wednesday, June 16, 2027: Depart home

Thursday, June 17: Arrive Manchester, ENGLAND | Transfer to Liverpool | Welcome reception

Arrive at Manchester Airport (MAN), where you will be met and transferred as a group (time TBD) to our hotel in Liverpool. Enjoy the balance of the day at leisure before gathering for a welcome reception. *Four nights at the 5-star [The Municipal Hotel & Spa](#).* (R)

Friday, June 18: Liverpool: Beatles tour, Strawberry Field, The Beatles Story | Welcome dinner

This morning, we enjoy a Beatles-themed bus tour of Liverpool. We stop by Penny Lane and the statues of the Fab Four, take a photo at their childhood homes, and perhaps glimpse *Father McKenzie writing the words of a sermon* at St. Peter's Church, where Paul and John first met. Next, we visit Strawberry Field, once a Salvation Army children's home and garden where, as a child, John loved to play and find solitude. A tour of Liverpool would not be complete without a visit to The Beatles Story, a museum that tells the story of the lives of The Boys. This evening, we gather for a welcome dinner at a local restaurant. (B,D)

Saturday, June 19: Liverpool: AM at leisure, British Music Experience, Cavern Club

After *A Hard Day's Night*, we enjoy a morning at leisure, perhaps to independently tour the childhood homes we stopped at the day before or to explore other parts of Liverpool. This

afternoon, we gather to visit the British Music Experience where we go on a visual journey through the history of British music and discover the soundtrack of a nation. It would not be a trip to Liverpool without visiting the famous Cavern Club, the venue

that launched The Beatles. After dinner, we transport ourselves back to the early 60s and listen to a Beatles cover band at the Club (pending confirmation). (B,D)

Sunday, June 20: WALES: Conwy Castle, Eryri National Park (Snowdonia) | Liverpool, ENGLAND

Today, we *Let It Be* and take a scenic journey to north Wales. Upon arrival, we visit Conwy Castle, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the finest examples of late 13th- and early 14th-century military architecture in Europe. Commissioned by King Edward I, the castle is perched on a rocky outcrop. From inside, we are treated to spectacular sea views, a well-preserved great hall, royal chapel, and private chambers. After lunch, we return to Liverpool by way of a scenic drive through Eryri, Wales' largest National Park, located in the northern part of the country. It consists of nine mountain ranges, Mount Snowdon—the highest mountain in the UK outside of Scotland—75 miles of coastline, and many thousands of hectares of native woodland. Dinner is on your own in Liverpool this evening. (B,L)

Monday, June 21: High-speed train to London | London: Royal Albert Hall, PM at leisure

This morning, *you say goodbye [to Liverpool], and I say hello* to London via first-class, high-speed train. Upon arrival, we tour the Royal Albert Hall, where the world's leading artists from many performance genres have graced its stage since it first opened in 1871 under

Queen Victoria. After The Beatles performed on the famous stage, Paul McCartney said: "...we felt like gods." Next, we check-in to our hotel, where the balance of the day and dinner are at leisure.

Four nights at the 4-star [The Bailey's Hotel London Kensington](#). (B)

Tuesday, June 22: London: Beatles-themed tour, Abbey Road Studios

Roll up, roll up for the Magical Mystery Tour. Step right this way! this morning, as we take a panoramic tour of London, including the London Palladium, where The Beatles performed to millions on TV; 34 Montagu Square, where members of the band lived at different times; and 3 Savile Row, location of the original Apple Corps headquarters and The Beatles' infamous 1969 rooftop performance, which turned out to be their final performance together as a group. After an independent lunch, we stop at Abbey Road Studios, where The Beatles recorded the majority of their catalog. Grab a few friends and *Come Together* to walk in the footsteps of John, Paul, George, and Ringo, as we recreate the Abbey Road album cover and stride across the zebra crossing (crosswalk). We cannot forget to leave our mark on the graffiti wall just outside the studio. The balance of the day and dinner are at leisure. (B)

Wednesday, June 23: Cotswolds | London

Today, we leave the *Helter Skelter* atmosphere of London behind and enjoy a day trip to the Cotswolds, known for idyllic villages oozing with quintessential English charm. It was here that "Beatlemania" gained momentum from one of The Mop Tops' performances, later becoming a phenomenon with their historic arrival in the U.S. We enjoy time at leisure and *turn off [our] mind, relax, and float downstream* while visiting a couple of Cotswolds towns, one of them being Stroud where The Beatles played early on in their career. This evening we return to London, where the balance of the day and dinner are at leisure. (B)

What to Expect



MODERATE: Must be able to walk one to three miles per day on mostly flat, but often uneven, terrain.

You must be able to make long walks, unassisted, over uneven terrain and up and down steps.

Some sites require strenuous and/or brisk walking or climbing, sometimes with difficult footing.

Participants who are not able to walk or stand unassisted for extended periods are kindly advised not to join this tour. All participants are expected to be physically active and not be an impediment to others on excursions, to enjoy traveling as part of a group, and to be ready to experience cultural differences. All participants will be required to follow safety/sanitization protocols set forth by Sponsors/Operator, local staff, and host country laws. Any participant showing signs of illness will be asked to wear a mask when in close proximity to others. If the tour manager decides that a participant cannot visit a site safely or in a timely manner, their judgment will be final. Where possible, an alternate activity may be suggested; additional costs may apply. If you have any questions about your ability to participate, we suggest that you visit your personal physician with this brochure in hand and discuss whether or not this program is appropriate for you. Hotels have been chosen for their excellent locations and generous comfort. Included meals are of a very high quality. At the time of year we visit, the weather is pleasant, with the average temperatures ranging from the low 50s F at night to the low 70s F during the day. There is always a chance for moderate rainfall and participants should come prepared for some wet weather. *Complete pre-departure details will be sent to participants.*

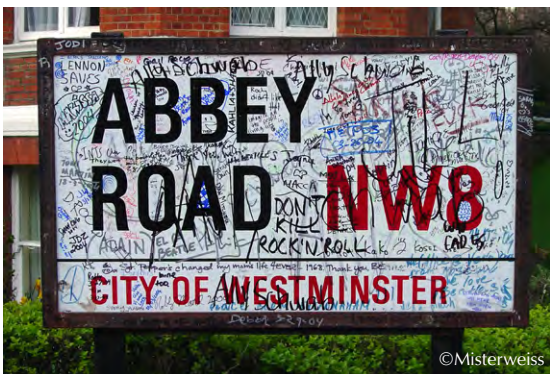
